




The President's Ramblins from DJ Stamp

My brother Jack lives in Urbandale which is a suburb of Des Moines where we enjoyed the Des Moines Concours. This is a first rate event downtown set up around an urban sculpture garden. I've seen vehicles there that I knew existed but had never seen before such as the GM Futureliners & a Hudson Italia. There were several British vehicles of note this year including a Nash Healey. There was a display of Metropolitans which were badged Nash & Hudson. I thought it was interesting to see the similar hood trim on the Healey & early Metros. There was a nice Morris Minor traveler complete with surfboards, an Austin A40, a Riley Elf, A Bentley, a Marcos GT & an early Morgan trike. Not sure if the Rolls was American or British.
