

#### Gitcho Mammo!!

Happy New Year!

Not that 2019 wasn't happy but it certainly had its challenges! I've been asked to share one of my challenges and because I believe it has an important message, I am doing just that.

I'm 63 years young (most days). I've had a relatively healthy and active life. I do all of the recommended annual checkups, not always enthusiastically. I do not have any history of breast cancer in my family. So when I was called back for a second mammogram and then a biopsy earlier this fall, I wasn't too concerned. I've had suspicious mammos before and, after further examination, they were dismissed as calcium deposits or fatty blobs.

This time around, everyone seemed a bit more concerned. Turns out, the little thing they saw in my mammogram was Invasive **D**uctal **C**arcinoma (IDC). It was about the size of a small pea. No way I could have found it on my own! I'm so thankful it was detected so early! Because it was early, early stage 1, I was a candidate for a relatively new procedure using a SAVI device! My radiation treatments were 2 times a day over 5 days(10 visits total). Amazing! I'm not going into the emotional aspects of all of this because each of us have had our journeys and I'm very fortunate in mine!

My message to everyone is to keep getting your mammograms and keep encouraging others to keep getting theirs! In other words: "Gitcho Mammo!"


